

Terms and Conditions for Use of the Online Edition of The Religion Case Reporter

The following terms and conditions govern the use of the online edition of *The Religion Case Reporter* (herein referred to as “the Online Edition”) published by Paradigm Publications, Inc., 1358 East 24th Street Brooklyn, New York (hereinafter referred to as “the Publisher”) by Emory University (hereinafter referred to as “the Subscriber”).

1. The Subscriber shall pay the Publisher \$ 1,000 (One Thousand Dollars) for use of the Online Edition for a period of one year. The one year period shall begin to run from two days after the Publisher receives from the Subscriber a list of the IP addresses to be registered by the Publisher. The Publisher shall register any and all IP addresses provided by the Subscriber and shall provide to the Subscriber access to the Online Edition via the registered IP addresses.
2. Subject to the provisions of Paragraph 3 of this Agreement, the Subscriber may make the Online Edition available via a remote proxy server.
3. Any person given permission by the Subscriber may access the Online Edition from any computer terminal whose IP address has been registered. However, access to the Online Edition via remote proxy server shall be password protected and limited to those persons who are current members of the faculty or other employees of Emory University and its affiliate institutions and to students in good standing at Emory University and its affiliate institutions.
4. The Publisher shall place no limit on the number of simultaneous users or the amount of allowable monthly data transfer.
5. The Publisher shall provide periodic Alerts of recent updates to the Online Edition to be emailed to any faculty member or librarian whose email address is provided to the Publisher.
6. All right, title, and interest (including all copyrights and other intellectual property rights) in the Online Edition (in both print and machine-readable forms) belong to the Publisher. The Subscriber acquires no proprietary interest in the Online Edition or any of its contents and, except as specifically provided herein, and may not use or make available the Online Edition or any materials retrieved from the Online Edition in any fashion that infringes the copyrights or proprietary interests of the Publisher.
7. The Subscriber to the Online Edition is granted, for research purposes, a nonexclusive, nontransferable, limited license to use the Online Edition. Pursuant to said limited license, the Subscriber may electronically display, print, copy and download any materials appearing in the Online Edition for its own use.
8. At any time, and without notice, materials and features may be added to or withdrawn from the Online Edition.
9. Unless an editor’s note specifically states otherwise, the extensive write-ups of judicial opinions that are provided on the Online Edition – hereinafter referred to as Case Digest(s) – are not word for word reproductions of the court opinions. It is understood that the digested judicial opinions, although often consisting for the most part of the court’s own words, are heavily edited and that all of the following occur without indication: extensive deletions are made; wording is changed or added to reflect the editor’s understanding of the court’s intent; text is transposed, often in large blocks, in order to more logically structure the court’s opinion and avoid repetitive

statements; footnotes are eliminated, or integrated into the text without indication; quotation marks are deleted. Dissenting or concurring opinions are covered in only a limited number of cases. The main purposes of the Case Digests are five-fold: (1) to give a detailed picture of the relevant facts of the case, so that one can see to what extent the facts of his or her case accord or vary from those in the case being digested; (2) to report on all the relevant legal issues raised by the case, (3) to report on the court's analysis and understanding of those legal issues, both within the context of prior case law and as applied to the facts of the case; (4) to set forth the holdings of the court; and (5) to do all this within an amount of space that sharply reduces the material one must read. However, there is no warranty that every fact, legal question, process of legal reasoning, discussion of prior case law reported in the court's opinion, or holding that a user of the Online Edition might find relevant or of interest is covered by the Case Digest. The very fact that the judicial opinions are heavily edited necessitates that some things must be omitted. It should also be understood that the Case Digests do not report on material in the judicial opinions that the editor, in his or her sole discretion, deems irrelevant to the purposes of the Online Edition. Thus, for example, discussions of procedural issues are often omitted and if an employee sues an employer for religious, racial, and sexual discrimination, the Case Digest will usually focus only on the facts and law relevant to the issue of religious discrimination. Cases involving prison inmates, criminal defendants, parents fighting over issues of custody, visitation, child support, etc., all may involve facts and issues that are both pertinent and irrelevant to the purposes of this publication and the Case Digests focus solely on the facts and issues the editor deems pertinent, often without any reference to the other facts and issues covered by the court's opinion.

10. There is no warranty that all judicial opinions – official or unofficial, for publication, or not for publication – that may be pertinent to the purposes of the Online Edition have been indexed and digested or that any judicial opinion that has been indexed and digested is the most current version of the judicial opinion or has not been affected, either directly or collaterally, by a subsequent court opinion or by subsequent legislative or administrative developments.

11. The materials in the Online Edition are provided on an "as is" basis and the Publisher expressly disclaims all warranties, including the warranties of merchantability and fitness for a particular purpose.

12. The Publisher shall not be liable for any loss, injury, claim, liability, or damage of any kind resulting in any way from (i) any errors in or omissions from the Online Edition or (ii) the temporary unavailability or interruption of the Online service.

13. The Publisher shall not be liable for any loss, injury, claim, liability, or damage of any kind resulting in any way from use of the Online Edition.

14. Once a Subscriber's access to the Online Edition has been activated, all monies owing under the terms of the individualized contract between the Subscriber and the Publisher are immediately due in full. In the event the Subscriber wishes to terminate its subscription to the Online Edition during the contract period, the Subscriber shall not be entitled to any refund of monies and any monies owing to the Publisher under the terms of this Agreement continue to remain an obligation of the Subscriber.

15. The right of the Subscriber to continued access to the Online Edition lapses upon breach of any of the provisions of this Agreement and the Publisher may, at any time during the remaining subscription term and in its sole discretion, cancel the Subscriber's limited license. If the Subscriber's license has been canceled pursuant to the Terms of this Agreement, the Subscriber

shall not be entitled to any refund and any monies owing to the Publisher under the terms of this Agreement remain an obligation of the Subscriber.

16. These Terms and Conditions shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of New York and shall be enforceable in the State of New York and the Subscriber agrees to submit to the personal jurisdiction of the State of New York.

17. The failure of the Publisher to enforce any provision of these Terms and Conditions shall not constitute or be construed as a waiver of such provision or of the right to enforce it at a later time.
